ere's an update from an ambitious young Grant Winner from the Caribbean island of Bequia.

Tavio Simmons (shown above) was a beneficiary of a Hunter's Grant, using funds raised locally, helping him realize his dream of exploring the future of sea moss farming.

With help from a local non-profit organization in 2020, Tavio received training in sea moss farming, providing him with the knowledge he needed in subsurface aquaculture and the potential for the local economy for this efficient farming method already successfully tested in neighboring islands.

Upon launching his business, a grant from Hunter's

Sea Moss is a red seaweed found along the coasts and is prized for its health benefits.

Rich in vitamins, minerals, and antioxidants, traditionally used in foods, remedies and skin care products.

Fund provided Tavio with scuba diving training and scientific data collection equipment needed to improve the yield and quality of his sea moss.

"Our initial methods, featuring a simple yet innovative combination of rope and recycled bottles for flotation, have been upgraded thanks to the grant from Hunter's Fund.

Now, we employ robust pipe frames and effective cement-made anchors, ensuring our sea moss farms resist strong ocean currents. These upgrades have enhanced our operations and drawn significant interest from tourists and locals alike."

Our venture operates as a three-man team, focusing on identifying strengths,

Hunter Watson's Birthday Interviews: A short film by Ted Watson

For over 20 years, Jerry Watson conducted annual interviews with each of his sons, Hunter and Teddy, on their birthdays. Through these interviews, Jerry attempted to capture the highlights of each boy's year.

This was no easy feat! Getting the young boys to sit still for the hour-long interviews was always a challenge. Jerry would find them crawling on furniture and even on top of his head during the early years. But the effort resulted in over 30 hours of video memories of school, sports, friends, hobbies and their goals for when they grew up. The last video was recorded when Hunter was heading off to college.

Tragically, in 2016 Hunter passed away at age 20 as a passenger in a distracted driving accident.

The family realized the birthday videos were a treasure trove of memories

but the problem was finding the most meaningful moments from among the many hours.

Hunter's brother Ted gamely volunteered to review the footage and spent a week closeted with his brother's videos. He has rarely spoken about the emotional impact of this experience but after a week emerged with an elegantly edited 10 minute film titled simply "Hunter Watson's Birthday Interviews."

Family and friends felt Ted had captured Hunter's essence – funny, thoughtful, engaging and impatient. The film was shown at Hunter's packed memorial service to powerful reactions.

Since then, "Birthday Interviews" has only been viewed in private. But in order to introduce new volunteers to Hunter, Hunter's Fund is now testing the film as part of Hunter's Fund Safe

Driving Weeks.

"Birthday Interviews" has become a cherished way for family and friends to remember Hunter Watson.

We offer it here to the Mustique Community Hunter loved and which was such an important part of his life.

You could begin your nature-filled day by driving north to **Dark View Falls**, nestled deep within the island's vibrant rainforests. This stunning two-tiered waterfall cascades down high cliff faces, plunging into pristine natural pools below. Walk

along the bamboo bridge spanning the tumbling river as you approach for a closer look. Take a refreshing swim in the cool pools surrounded by lush greenery. Let the misty spray wash over you as you relax near the base of the falls. The tranquil setting amid unspoiled tropical wilderness makes Dark View Falls an ideal spot to commune with nature.

Or, drive up the winding roads along the island's scenic windward coast to reach **Belmont Lookout.** From this vantage point, marvel at the panoramic views of the rolling hills and valleys of the Marriaqua countryside. On clear days, you can even spot the neighboring islands of Bequia, Baliceaux, and Battowia dotted along the glittering Caribbean Sea. Breathe in the fresh ocean air as you take in the sweeping island vistas.

Alternately, explore the diverse botanical wonders of **Montreal Gardens**. Lush tropical flowers and

plants flourish throughout these gardens, with a river running through the grounds. Your guide will lead you along meandering pathways under canopies of leafy vegetation. See rare indigenous species as well as imported flowers from around the world. The vibrant colors and textures surround you with natural beauty.

The day could also be spent by driving inland through rainforests to reach **La Soufrière**, an active volcano and the island's highest peak at 4,048ft. While carefully maintained trails lead up the mountain, take in the epic views of the volcano's sheer crater walls and steaming fumaroles from a safe distance. Admire the raw power of nature displayed before you.

With its wealth of unspoiled tropical landscapes, scenic vistas, and serene natural attractions, a day trip immerses you in the magnificent beauty of St. Vincent.

Return home feeling refreshed and rejuvenated after a day escaping into the island's natural splendor.





Your support and Hunter's Grants build on Gladwell's 10,000 Hour Theory of Success

"We overlook just how large a role we all play – and by 'we' I mean society – in determining who makes it and who doesn't."

That's an excerpt from journalist Malcolm Gladwell's best-selling book "Outliers: The Story of Success." Throughout Outliers, Gladwell argues that the most successful, high-achieving people in the world – from business tycoons and multi-millionaires to Nobel Peace Prize winners and famous artists and athletes - reached the pinnacles of success not solely through self-will or innate talent, but through a series of outside factors and lucky life circumstances.

One of Gladwell's theories says that it takes 10,000 hours of "deliberate practice" to achieve mastery in any field. According to his theory, anyone who practices a specific skill for 10,000 hours - or 20 hours a week for 10 years - will become world-class in their endeavor.

But more often than not, young people without strong financial resources and support systems lack the time and energy to devote themselves toward developing their skills and passions - leaving success out of reach despite their innate talent.

"Today many parents are not even able to provide for the education and basic needs of their children. They are hesitant to give a talented son or

daughter extra help without taking away from the needs of their brother or sisters," says Jerry Watson, co-founder of Hunter's Fund.

Hunter's Fund frequently receives applications from young people seeking funds to purchase the necessary equipment to practice their skills and develop their creative projects. Many of these applicants have dedicated their free time to refine their crafts but found themselves unable to make progress without the right tools.

"One applicant could not afford the cost of equipment to make a demo of his songs. We provided him with recording equipment so he could accomplish this on his own schedule and at the same time learn the art of mixing his music," Watson says. "Two years later, he was awarded a recording contract from Epic Records and is now on tour where thousands are enjoying the music he dreamed of sharing."

Through financial aid and dedicated mentorship, Hunter's Fund is working to empower young people to pursue their intrinsic passions, find fulfillment in their work, and inspire a new generation of creative thinkers.

Spotlight on: **Grant Winner** Oshakie Gittens

Now, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines native Oshakie Gittens wants to bring a piece of the pie to North Union, his home village on the island.

Gittens has spent the last nine years honing his game design and coding skills as a self-taught computer programmer. Now, with a track record of successful launches behind him, Gittens is preparing for a venture of his own: an independent gaming studio called Vincitech.

"A gaming studio will ultimately provide an opportunity for us to showcase these ideas and concepts to the world, creating more recognition for our little nation," Gittens says.

Oshakie's grant from Hunter's Fund will fund new computer equipment and software assets for Vincitech.

Charity Begins on Mustique

The proverb, charity begins at home, dates to the time of the Roman comic playwright, Terence (about 190-159 BC). Over the years, the definition has evolved. In 1383, John Wycliffe wrote: "charity should begin at himself." Five hundred years later Dickens said, "charity begins at home, and justice begins next door." The Cambridge Dictionary definition is "you should take care of your family and other people who live close to you before helping people who live further away or in another country."

Charities on Mustique are the embodiment of this proverb and are engaged in a variety of activities to serve different needs of the local population. Hunter's Fund applauds their work while it continues it's focus on: saving lives through its distracted driving campaigns and encouraging entrepreneurship through its grant programs. Here's a list of the charities which are actively working to improve the lives of the local population:

Basil Charles Educational

Foundation – started in 1996. The Foundation started a scholarship program to help offset the cost of secondary education and make it more accessible to those in need. Additionally, funds support early childhood education and a STEM summer program. Most of the funding comes from the revenue generated by the annual Mustique Blues Festival.

Hunter's Fund - established in 2016 by Hunter's friends from Mustique who were devastated by the loss of their friend Hunter Watson who died as a passenger in a distracted driving accident. They wanted to help young people from St. Vincent and the Grenadines who had visions of something they wanted to be but lacked the resources to explore those dreams and whose parents worked so hard to make this paradise possible. Funding for the Mustique program is provided exclusively by visitors and homeowners who come to our beautiful island and want to help fund the dreams of these young people.

Mustique Charitable Trust

- founded in 2008 and funded by the homeowners of Mustique. The mission is to improve the opportunities of children, young people and vulnerable adults while supporting the development of sustainable local communities throughout SVG. The Trust aims to coordinate and enhance the charitable giving of the Mustique community.

Mustique Educational

Trust – established 30 years ago by Mick Jagger, Basil Charles and Ouida Touche, it was founded to establish a primary school for the children of Mustique and secondary school support for the children of those who work on Mustique. Additional activities include the provision of interest-free loans for post-secondary education, adult education programs such as literacy, math, computers and skill training.

Mustique Medical Trust - In cooperation with Dr. Michael Bunbury, the Trust provides funds for emergency services for the local population. Funded primarily from donations from grateful patients and others who value the availability of emergency services.

svG Environment Fund – founded a couple of years ago by Bryan Adams, is a non-profit dedicated to supporting the most effective environmental projects and campaigns. The Fund gives grants to both organizations and individuals actively engaged in the region, and with its partners, works to protect and restore the natural environment and influence locals and visitors to be more

respectful of their surroundings.

Flashback to 2021:

Girl Guides Association Partners with Hunter's Fund to End Distracted Driving

Hunter's Pledge to End Distracted Driving is coming to the community thanks to a new partnership with the Girl Guides Association of St. Vincent and The Grenadines.

The Hunter's Pledge program was developed in 2016 as a way to encourage young adults to change their driving behaviors. Throughout each school year, participants at colleges and universities across the United States set up tabling events where students are encouraged to sign a pledge committing to avoid distracted driving. In total, 20,000 students have signed the pledge. (Today the number has grown to 60,000.)

Chevelle Campbell, Chairperson of the Junior Council for the Girl Guides Association of Saint Vincent and The Grenadines, said that distracted driving education is especially important in the lives of young adults on the island.

"There are a lot of distracted drivers on the island," Campbell said. "Especially teenagers who just got their license and they drive recklessly, always on their phone and always texting. They're not paying attention to how dangerous it is."

With approximately 2,300 mem-

bers in St. Vincent and The Grenadines, the Girl Guides program encourages young girls and women to become agents of change by speaking up and taking action on important issues in their communities.

Through the partnership with Hunter's Fund, the Girl Guides will encourage community members to sign the pledge to avoid distracted driving.

"In St. Vincent and the Grenadines, we struggle with safe driving, especially college students and public transportation," Campbell said "They contribute to a high percentage of accidents relating to distracted driving... safe driving should be encouraged more in the community."

While the pandemic and social distancing requirements postponed the majority of in-person events planned by the organization, Campbell said that Girl Guides members throughout the region have participated in virtual activities in order to keep their causes alive.

"We were unable to meet face to face," Campbell said. "However, it allowed us to take advantage of the internet by posting activities for all members to take part in."

Recipe

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons of coconut oil 1 large onion, finely chopped 3 cloves of garlic, minced 1 scotch bonnet pepper,

seeded and minced (adjust to taste)

1 pound of callaloo leaves, washed and finely chopped 1 cup of dasheen or taro

leaves, chopped (as a substitute for callaloo leaves if unavailable)

1 cup of fresh pumpkin, peeled and diced

1 cup of fresh coconut cream

4 cups of fish stock or water 1 pound of fresh fish (red snapper or kingfish), cut into chunks

1 sprig of thyme Salt and black pepper to taste

In a large pot, heat the coconut oil over medium heat. Add the chopped onions and sauté until they are soft and translucent.

Incorporate the minced garlic and scotch bonnet pepper, and sauté for another minute.

Add the callaloo (or dasheen) leaves, stirring until wilted. Then add the diced pumpkin and continue cooking for a few minutes.

Pour in the fresh coconut cream and fish stock (or water) and bring the mixture to a gentle simmer.


Gently add the chunks of fresh fish and thyme to the pot. Season with salt and black pepper to taste.

Let the soup simmer for about 20-25 minutes, allowing the flavors to meld together and the fish to cook through.

Taste the soup and adjust the seasonings if necessary.

Once the soup has reached the desired consistency and flavor, remove it from the heat.

Serve the Callaloo soup hot, ideally with some traditional hard dough bread or bakes.



Callaloo (pronounced kalalu) soup, a cherished culinary gem, finds its roots in the heart of Caribbean cuisine while tracing its origins back to West Africa. This rich and flavorful dish, with its vibrant combination of ingredients, epitomizes the cultural fusion that defines the Caribbean culinary landscape.




